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Third Party Reimbursement Review

DAVE HAMMOND NOTES FROM NWATA IATA BUISNESS MEETING.

Step 1 - To identify payor targets and then best to contact. Such as Blue Cross Blue Shield of Idaho, Regence of Idaho, Select Health or St. Luke's Health, Idaho Medicaid and Workers Compensation. This includes discussion with athletic trainers who are currently succeeding at reimbursement and pilot studies.

Step 2 - Define and tailor our why, define our ask. Do we start with specific or general requests? By understanding and knowing our ask we are able inquire

and solicit interested payors and providers. Step 3 - Aim for 2-3 payors meetings with the goal to attain at least one provider interested in billable

athletic training services. Step 4 - Strategic follow up with payor meetings and non meetings that will address pitfalls. Reevaluation of strategy based on key finding as necessary.



In 2014, the National Athletic Trainers' Association Third Party Reimbursement Initiative Pilot Project (TPRI) launched a joint initiative between the NATA and three individual state athletic training associations (Indiana, Ohio and Wisconsin). Since then the initiative has worked with 25 states and gained recognition by nearly 300 payors that recognize the AT as a reimbursable health care provider (NATA News- October 2024). In 2019 the Idaho Athletic Trainers Association (IATA) distributed a similar survey to gauge member interest- this is a request for member participation in a 5 year follow-up on the initiative.

The intent of TPRI is to continue to support state level advocacy for athletic trainers with payers and employers, while building and maintaining coordinated efforts nationally. The states that choose to participate will be expected to share key learning and data as part of a larger network that will drive progress nationally. Our goal is for Idaho to contribute towards this initiative.

Governmental Affairs Committee Recap

HIT THE HILL - FEBURARY 2025

Hit the hill in February was a successful effort, even with the weather providing the challenging roads and snowy weather. Twelve Certified Athletic Trainers with roughly twenty athletic training student representing Idaho State University and Boise State University braved the 1st floor rotunda. Even two high school CTE students from Boise High School joined in the efforts to spread the name of athletic trainers are here! There were 30 face-to-face meetings with legislators and at least 20 drop offs to legislator offices.

This work resulted in Bill HB60 (Sudden Cardiac Arrest Prevention) being terminated and a replacement bill, HB313, is up for a second reading in the House of Health and Welfare Committee. This bill effects public secondary schools and clinic AT as it is in regards to decisions made by coaches if an cardiac event occurs.

The GAC will continue to watch the current legislative season as there are many changes in the legislators.

Please let us know if there are any questions concerning Division of Occupational and Professional Licenses (DOPL) regarding licensure renewals and newly certified athletic trainers.
